Giannini Brass

Anita Cirba and **Kenneth Wilmot**, trumpets; **Chris Ferguson**, trombone; **David Nicholson**, tuba and Joe Mount, horn.

Named after composer and educator Vittorio Giannini, the founder of the North Carolina School of the Arts, the Giannini Brass is the professional brass ensemble-in-residence for the North Carolina School of the Arts. Its members both teach at the School and perform with major orchestras and on radio and television stations throughout the United States and Europe. The ensemble has released four recordings: Big-Shot Brass, Christmas with the Giannini Brass, Baroque Banquet and Mit Freuden zart (With Tender Joy): Moravian Chorales for Brass.

All five performers boast exceptional credentials:

Anita Cirba is principal trumpet of both the Winston-Salem and Greensboro Symphony Orchestras. In demand as a soloist, she has performed as soloist with both orchestras, as well as appearing last season with the Southeastern Ohio Orchestra. Anita played with the Cleveland Orchestra at Carnegie Hall.

Chris Ferguson is in demand as a freelance musician performing with a variety of organizations including touring Broadway productions, symphony orchestras, big bands and the rodeo. He is principal trombone with the Salisbury Symphony and the Long Bay Symphony in Myrtle Beach, SC.

David Nicholson is currently principal tuba with the Greensboro (NC) Symphony and has performed with orchestras throughout the Southeast including the Charlotte and Charleston (SC) Symphonies. David has been the tuba and low brass instructor for Greensboro College and Davidson College. At Tanglewood, David performed with the Empire Brass Quintet and Atlantic Brass Quintet.

Kenneth Wilmot is a member of the Winston-Salem and Greensboro Symphonies. He has also performed with the New York String Orchestra, the New World Symphony and recently with the Eastern Philharmonic (Eastern Music Festival Orchestra). He has appeared and toured with a variety of popular and jazz artists such as The Four Tops, the Tommy Dorsey Orchestra and the Glenn Miller Orchestra.

Joseph Mount performs with numerous orchestras and chamber music ensembles throughout the Southeast. In addition to performing with the Giannini Brass, he is currently a member of the Winston-Salem and Greensboro Symphonies and the Carolina Chamber Symphony, and has performed with the North Carolina Symphony, Charlotte Symphony and Charleston (SC) Symphony.




